Founded in 1969, GWA was established as an independent college-preparatory coeducational day school and is located on 60 wooded acres within Walton County. George Walton serves students from 10 counties and represents a wide range of economic, ethnic, and religious backgrounds. GWA's enrollment is 792 students Pre-K3 through 12th grade; the Upper School (grades 9-12) has 278 students, and the Class of 2024 totals 69 students.

DIPLOMA DISTINCTION PROGRAMS

Students have the opportunity to opt in to a diploma distinction program in either Global Studies or Fine Arts. In addition to their traditional graduation requirements, students must complete specific coursework, outside readings and lectures and travel or service components. Both programs culminate in a senior capstone project that is presented to a committee of faculty members, community experts and interested students about a passion topic of their choice. Each student meets with a faculty advisor throughout the program and is held to standards beyond the traditional curriculum. The distinction programs were created to provide an opportunity for students to explore a topic beyond their classroom studies that mimics a collegiate research experience and connects them with experts beyond our campus.

WINTER TERM

GWA upper school students have opportunities each academic year to gain real-world experience or study non-traditional topics during a two-week intensive winter term titled "Dawg Days." During this time, students take a departure from their regular courses and curriculum and have the choice to participate in internships, travel, or on-campus creative courses that cover a wide range of interests and fields such as Introduction to Law Enforcement, Sports Psychology, & A Local Odyssey - History of Monroe. Students are required to participate and earn a half credit per Winter Term.
